Who is it for?

The groups welcome families who have a child, aged O-3, with complex additional support needs and associated medical interventions.

Pre-school brothers and sisters can also come along.

What does it offer the Children?

A safe and stimulating environment suited to their individual needs, in which they are encouraged to play and learn about the world around them. They will have access to multi-sensory room experiences.

What does it offer parents and Carers?

The playgroups are informal so parents can join play activities with their child and enjoy a break with other parents over a cup of tea or coffee.

Practical advice, information and support from both staff and other parents is an important function of the group.

The Bright Start Playgroups run in addition to existing ASL Service support.

The playgroups are run by qualified staff from Braidburn or Oaklands Schools or The Additional Support for Learning Service, who have wide experience in working with children with complex support needs.
